



ABOUT THE COURSE

This course has been developed to equip you with the knowledge and skills needed to effectively carry out functional fire door inspections.

Unlike many courses that focus solely on **certified** doors, this programme also covers **nominal and notional** fire doors — recognising that many buildings still contain doors installed before modern standards and test evidence were introduced. You'll learn how to inspect these doors in a practical, proportionate way, considering their construction, condition, and suitability for continued service.

Learners are encouraged to reflect on their own competence in relation to the SKEB model — Skills, Knowledge, Experience, and Behaviour - which is taught as part of the course learning materials.

This course provides essential knowledge and understanding of fire door components, regulations, and inspection principles. Developing full competence in fire door inspection requires ongoing practice, supervised experience, and the right professional context to apply learning safely and effectively.



WHO IS THIS QUALIFICATION FOR?

The NSA | Fire Door Inspection course is for individuals who have responsibility for carrying out fire door inspections in-house or for a variety of external clients.

These individuals might include:

- Fire safety consultants
- Fire risk assessors
- Building managers
- Facilities managers
- Safety professionals

WHO IS THIS QUALIFICATION NOT SUITABLE FOR?

This course alone is unlikely to provide an appropriate level of competence to carry out fire door surveys. Whilst this course will provide a knowledge base enabling the learner to go on to carry out these responsibilities in the future, further study and experience would certainly be required before they would be considered competent to do so.

This course does not cover destructive fire door inspection or manufacture and installation of fire doors in any substantive detail.



LEARNING OUTCOMES

Upon successful completion of the course, you will be able to:

- Explain the principles of fire development and the role of fire doors in preventing the spread of fire and smoke within buildings.
- Interpret key fire safety legislation, guidance, and standards relevant to the selection, use, and maintenance of fire doors.
- Carry out effective fire door inspections, identifying noncompliances and recording findings in line with regulatory and organisational requirements.
- Demonstrate the competence, communication, and practical judgement needed to manage fire doors in occupied buildings and support ongoing compliance.



YOUR LEARNING JOURNEY

CONTENT

Our course syllabus ensures progressive learning, building from foundational principles to practical application. You will study nine blocks that guide your development step by step.

Block 1 | What is fire?

Explore how fires start, develop, and spread. You'll learn about the fire tetrahedron, ignition sources, and the stages of fire growth.

Block 2 | What is a fire door?

Discover the role of fire doors in protecting life and property. This block explains compartmentation, the role of fire doors in containing fire and smoke, and why correct installation and maintenance matter.

Block 3 | Legislation and guidance

Gain a clear understanding of fire safety law, including the duties of the Responsible Person and the requirements of key legislation such as the Regulatory Reform (Fire Safety) Order and Building Safety Act 2022.

Block 4 | Who can inspect a fire door?

Explore the different types of fire door inspections – from basic observations to detailed surveys. You'll also learn what "competency" means in the context of fire door inspection with reference to SKEB – skills, knowledge, experience, and behaviours.

Block 5 | Fire door certification and standards

Understand how fire doors are tested, certified, and marked to demonstrate performance and compliance. You'll learn how to interpret certification labels and the importance of documentation.

CONTENT (CONT.)

Block 6 | Components of a fire door

Examine each element that makes up a fire door set - from door leaves and frames to seals, hinges, and glazing. Understand how every component works together to maintain integrity and performance in the event of a fire.

Block 7 | Carrying out fire door inspections

Develop the practical skills to plan and conduct thorough fire door inspections. You'll learn how to follow a structured inspection process, identify common faults and how they might be addressed.

Block 8 | Record-keeping and reports

Understand the importance of clear, consistent documentation in maintaining fire door safety. This block covers how to produce inspection records and use the NSA Fire Door Inspection Report.

Block 9 | Putting it into practice

Apply your learning in real-world contexts. Explore how to set appropriate inspection frequencies, manage fire doors in occupied buildings, and communicate effectively with occupants. Case studies reinforce practical decision-making and demonstrate how to maintain compliance in everyday situations.


DURATION

ASSESSMENT

HOW WILL I BE ASSESSED?

NSA assessments are designed to reflect real life, and enable you to demonstrate the skills that are required in a workplace. They are designed to measure your understanding of key concepts, your ability to apply knowledge in real-world situations, and your critical thinking skills.

Our Fire Door Inspection course consists of three assessments in total.

Assessment 1 | Knowledge test

The first assessment is the knowledge test which takes place midcourse after Block 6. You'll have 60 minutes to answer 30 questions which assess a mixture of both solely technical knowledge and scenario-based application.

Assessment 2 | Skills test

Once you have reached the end of the learning materials, the second assessment you'll need to complete is the skills test. You'll need to record yourself describing the door set and any issues you have identified, as well as discussing your approach to the inspection.

Assessment 3 | Fire door inspection

The final course assessment is a virtual inspection of two fire doors in two different buildings. All of the photographic inspection evidence and measurements needed are provided for you to analyse. You must complete a suitable fire door inspection report for each door.



COMPLETING YOUR ASSESSMENTS

When you reach the relevant points in the course, you will be able to complete your assessments when you are ready from within the learning portal.

The timescales to complete each assessment is as follows:

Assessment 1	60 minutes
Assessment 2	4 weeks
Assessment 3	4 weeks

GRADING AND FEEDBACK

Assessment 1 will be marked instantly once you reach the end of the test. You will need to answer at least 80% of the questions correctly to pass.

Assessment 2 and Assessment 3 will be marked by our team of assessors will aim to mark your assessment and provide feedback within 10 working days, which you'll be able to access through your learning portal.

We use a Pass/Refer grading system. This simply means:

- Pass: You've met all the assessment criteria great job!
- Refer: One or more of the assessment criteria was not met.

RESUBMISSIONS

Remember, a 'refer' isn't a fail - it's an opportunity to refine your skills and knowledge so you can be even more effective in keeping people safe in real life.

Your assessor will provide feedback on any parts of the assessment where you haven't fully met the criteria. This feedback will clearly highlight the specific areas that need improvement, so you'll know exactly where to return to the learning materials and review your understanding.

When you're ready, you can resubmit your assessment at any time, after payment of the associated fee. For information on current fees, please review our Resubmission and Late Submission Policy.

CERTIFICATION

Once you have passed all of the required assessments, you will just need to complete our identity verification checks before your digital certificate is issued.

Hard copy certificates are available on request for a fee of £20 + VAT.
